Synopsis

The story revolves around Aalo, a city-bred girl from a highly cultured family, who migrates to a faraway backward village after her marriage. The people she encounters here, particularly the womenfolk, are poverty-stricken, superstitious, narrow-minded and, at times, cruel. This is the story about how Aalo succeeds in removing their backwardness - both mental and cultural.

Four times National Award winner and a recipient of 'Padma Shri' award from the President of India, Tariun Majumder chooses his themes which are close to the soil and the people of his country and expresses them in a simple-looking manner although the mechanism, at times, may be highly complex.
